## Annual Meeting

Dade County Federal Credit Union's Annual Meeting is scheduled for **Wednesday, July 8, 2026, at 10:00 a.m.** The meeting will be held at the Main Office, located at **1500 NW 107th Avenue, Sweetwater, FL 33172**. The Nominating Committee has reaffirmed the appointment of the following individuals to continue serving on the Board of Directors.

**Edward Marquez** retired from public service on August 11, 2023. Following his retirement, he was elected to the Board of Directors of Dade County Federal Credit Union as Assistant Secretary. Edward Marquez was appointed Chief Financial Officer/Finance Director of the Miami-Dade County government by the Honorable Daniella Levine Cava in November 2020, and he also served as Deputy Mayor under the administration of Honorable Mayor Carlos A. Gimenez starting in August 2011. Under both administrations, Mr. Marquez was responsible for overseeing the internal management functions of the County, which included the County's Management and Budget, Human Resources, Internal Services, Finance, Audit and Management, and Information Technology departments.

Prior to his engagements with Miami-Dade County, Mr. Marquez was Senior Vice President of First Southwest Company, an investment banking and financial advisory firm, and managed its Miami Office. He has also served as Chief Financial Officer of the Miami-Dade County School Board - the fourth largest school district in the United States. Prior to his tenure at the School Board, Mr. Marquez served as Miami's City Manager where he directed the development of the Five-Year Fiscal and Operational Recovery Plan and coordinated a joint business-government blue ribbon task force to improve municipal efficiencies. As a result, Mr. Marquez effectively guided a near bankrupt city government, with a \$400 Million operating and capital improvement budget and a workforce of 3,500, toward fiscal well-being.

**George Joseph** is the President, CEO, and Board Treasurer of Dade County Federal Credit Union. He has more than 38 years of experience in the financial industry, including over 30 years dedicated to credit unions. In 1998, Mr. Joseph left his position as a Principal Examiner at the National Credit Union Administration (NCUA) — the federal agency that regulates credit unions — to become Executive Vice President of Dade County Federal Credit Union, later assuming the role of CEO in November 2000, a position he still holds today. He graduated from Andrews University, earning a BBA in accounting and a minor in Theology. Mr. Joseph also actively supports several charities, having previously served as Chairman for both March for Babies and the Juvenile Diabetes Foundation. Additionally, he helps raise funds for a number of local associations and non-profits.

For those interested in being placed on the ballot for a position on the Board, federal bylaws permit nomination by petition. The petition must be signed by 500 members. You may need to provide identification to obtain the petition. The petition must be received by the Nominating Committee no later than May 29, 2026. An official petition form may be obtained from the Secretary of the Credit Union during regular business hours.

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
